Project

Our project for this term is a history topic 'The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain'. We are going to be learning about the legend of how Rome was founded, the Roman government and the Roman Empire geographically over time and the legacy of the Romans.

Reading

We will have daily quiet reading sessions, so please make sure children have their diaries and books in their bags **every day**. Lots of children in the Autumn have not been recording their reading and forgetting their diaries and books. Please, please, please wherever possible, read with your child everyday at home. It is the single thing which makes a MASSIVE difference to their confidence, achievement and ability to access learning in the classroom- even when they are in Year 5 and 6!

SMART

Please remember to make use of the SMART apps for which we pay the children's subscriptions. DoodleLearning has four separate apps: DoodleMaths, DoodleEnglish, DoodleSpell and DoodleTables. The children's DoodleLearning login is the same for all the apps, and they're all great to help fill any gaps. We will awarding certificates to children who are in the green zone on their DoodleLearning every Friday as an extra incentive to be SMART!

The children's Oddizzi login this year is hive 56 and the password is the same. They can also use TT Rockstars to practise their timetables too.

Swimming

A few children will be continuing with swimming lessons- I will message you on Dojo if this is the case for your child. Everyone else has finished swimming lessons for this year. We do have the swimming gala on Friday 12th January, so those in the team will need their kit for a practice on Monday 8th January.
