Six months after the Taliban seized power in Kabul, Afghanistan, there have been big changes to the lives of many in the country, particularly for the younger generation.

The BBC has reported that more and more Afghan children are having to work to help support themselves and their families. As many people have not been paid for months, some children have had to work and earn money, instead of going to school. The Taliban also declared that girls would no longer be able to attend secondary school. Some schools are campaigning hard to remain open for all pupils.

- What do you think life might be like for young people in Afghanistan at the moment? How do you think they might be feeling?



Can you make custard slime?



You will need:

1 cup of custard powder, ½ cup of water, large mixing bowl

- 1. Pour 1 cup of custard powder into a large mixing bowl then mix in $\frac{1}{2}$ a cup of water.
- 2. Now get in there with your hands- try grabbing a handful, pressing it into a ball and then relaxing your grip.

Hit it, scratch it, stir it - it's crazy! Mixing cornflour (the main ingredient in custard powder) with water makes a non-Newtonian fluid. Without any pressure on it, the cornflour particles flow around suspended in water and the mix acts like a liquid. But put pressure on it and the water is pushed out the way, the cornflour particles pack together and it acts like a solid!



Email 2 - The Three C's

I mentioned in the previous email that you can't know everything. It's impossible to know all the risks and issues that our children might face online, much as it is impossible to know all the risks and issues they may face in the real world.

In this second video, which is just over 6 minutes, I discuss what is commonly called the 3C's which refers to: Content, Contact and Conduct.

The 3C's is the easiest way of understanding risk regardless of whether you think you are tech savvy or not.
