Project

Reading

The children will continue to read independently when they arrive at school in the morning, and we endeavor to hear them read as often as we can. SMART

Please remember to make use of the SMART apps for which we pay the children's subscriptions. Doodle Learning has four separate apps and the children's login details are the same for all the apps. The children also have accounts for Reading Eggs, Times Table Rock Stars and Oddizzi. Login details for all apps have been shared with you already and should be stuck in the front of the children's reading diaries, but if you have any trouble locating these details, please let me know and I will send them to you again.

Times Tables and Spellings

The children will continue to be assessed half termly on their ability to recall their times tables. The Multiplication Tables Check will take place for the children in Year 4 in June. More information will be shared with the Year 4 parents regarding the check in the coming weeks. Without practicing their times tables, the children will not meet the required standard, therefore regular practice at home is essential.
